It is with heavy hearts that the family of Glenn Ray Hodgkinson announce his passing on Monday, April 1, 2019 at the age of 85.

Glenn Ray Hodgkinson was born on December 31, 1933 in Oregon City, Oregon to Walter and Eloise (Singleterry) Hodgkinson. After high school Glenn joined the United States Army and was stationed in post WWII Europe. After returning home, he completed the electrician program for IBEW #48 whom he worked for until his retirement in 1995.

Glenn married Phylis Rautenberg, the love of his life in 1963. They raised three sons, David, Brian, and Walter. While raising his boys, Glenn served as a Scoutmaster with the Boy Scouts of America.
