Carol and her family lived at Park Place until she was 13 when they moved to West Linn where she attended and graduated from West Linn High school.

Carol being the oldest was frequently given the responsibility of watching her younger siblings and she enjoyed going for walks with them, taking them to hair appointment set and spending time with them. As they all got older and began having families of their own, they all remained close, enjoying family reunions, holiday celebrations, birthday parties and getting together "just because they wanted to".

Prior to meeting Vernon Still, Carol had been married for a brief time and in 1958, she gave birth to a son, Earl A Christman on November 12th and since she was unable to have more children, he became her heart and soul.
