**L**orraine H. Round of Milwaukie , Oregon, died on May 13, 2016.

Born Marie Lorraine House on September 17, 1920 in Tacoma, Washington, little Lorraine quickly became the center of attention-and affection--due to her constant happy nature and cherubic smile. After losing her beloved mother, "Honey," to an untimely death, Lorraine was raised by her father until enrolling in a private High School, where she enjoyed some of the happiest times of her young life.
