# James "Mace" Peveler

James "Mace" Peveler, long-term resident of Canby, Oregon and senior vice president of major projects and project development at Wilson Construction, passed away at the age of 61 on November 25, 2024, after an eight-month long battle with leukemia.

Mace is survived by his mother, Ronna Childers; his children, Katelin and Logan Peveler; his brother, Blane Peveler; and his nephew Blane Peveler II. He is predeceased by his father, Louis Peveler.

Mace was born on October 18, 1963, in Chickasha, Oklahoma. He graduated from Pine Tree High School in Longview, Texas in 1982 where he played the drums in the band, eventually becoming band captain.
